WORKING SESSION - JULY 17, 1991

The working session of the Ann Arbor City Council was called to order in the AATA Board Room at 7:35 p.m. by Mayor Elizabeth S. Brater.

UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN POLICE CONTRACT

Mayor Brater said that the purpose of the working session is because of questions raised as to whether over-head costs were built into the contract and to examine the issue of protecting the civil rights of the citizens of Ann Arbor.

Administrative Services Costs Discussed

Chief Smith presented a breakdown of personnel costs which include: average costs for wage, holiday overtime, pensions, workers' compensation, health insurance, eye/dental/life, longevity and uniforms for police officers, detectives, supervisors, clerical support, communications operators. The area where full costs will not be recovered is administration, training and supervision and use of the holding cells. A consensus of the Council was to ask the Administrator to work out an indirect administrative costs ratio for the purpose of this agreement and to negotiate those costs with the University of Michigan.

City/University Police Interaction, Physical Boundaries and Civil Rights

City Attorney R. Bruce Laidlaw said that paragraph No. 1 states that City Officers employed under this agreement will enforce City ordinances and state statutes only in accordance with City policies. A further supplement to this agreement will be an exchange of "letters of understanding" which will address specific events such as the "Hash Bash." Further points of discussion included: Civil rights, dissemination of information to citizens regarding those rights, jurisdictions of complaint and opportunity for redress. In addition, the Council discussion covered physical boundaries of enforcement with regard to calls received on 911 and incidents observed by patrolling police cars. A consensus of Council was that clarification language be added to the agreement covering the above points of concern.

There being no further business, The Chair declared the meeting adjourned at 8:15 p.m.
