



# FREE FALL LEAF DELIVERY OPTIONS FOR CITY RESIDENTS, LANDSCAPERS & HAULERS

City of Ann Arbor, Michigan – [www.a2gov.org/leaves](http://www.a2gov.org/leaves)

**DATES:** Unlimited free leaf drop-off from City of Ann Arbor properties is available non-holiday weekdays from September through December.

**TIMES:** Residents with under 3 cubic yards may deliver leaves on weekdays between 8 a.m.-4 p.m. **Landscapers and haulers may use the Scalehouse on weekdays between 8-Noon, and 2-4 p.m.**

**COSTS:** Leaves from Ann Arbor properties may be dropped off at no charge. All leaves from outside Ann Arbor will be assessed \$15/cubic yard. To avoid scale backups and delays during peak recycling times, haulers will be charged \$15/cubic yard for leaves delivered between 12-2 p.m.

**LOCATION:** All drivers check in at the Scalehouse, 4150 Platt Road, Ann Arbor, MI 48108 (734.794.6380). After check-in, drivers will be directed to the appropriate location to drop-off leaves at the Compost Center.

## **THERE ARE TWO PERMIT APPROACHES AVAILABLE FOR FREE LEAF DROP-OFF:**

### **PERMIT “A” FOR INDIVIDUAL CITY RESIDENTS, PROPERTY OWNERS, TENANTS:**

- Note: Under 3 cubic yards—no permit is required. Residents drive over the scale and show proof of residency (drivers license, water bill) at the window. (Vehicles with less than 3 cubic yards will not need to record empty vehicle weights.)
- If not a City resident and bringing leaves for an Ann Arbor resident, use Permit A.
- For all residential 3+ cubic yards of leaves, turn in signed permit A .

### **PERMIT “B” FOR MULTIPLE PROPERTIES, COMMERCIAL LANDSCAPERS & HAULERS:**

- Turn in Permit B, signed by business owner/manager, good for the year.
- Attach a list or spreadsheet of Ann Arbor customer addresses (not to be shared).
- Each vehicle will need to have an empty truck weight on file before or immediately following the first bulk leaves drop-off. On future deliveries, weight will be on file.
