Rechargeable Battery Recycling

Motor Oil Recycling

Most automotive service stations accept used motor oil in sturdy, sealed containers for recycling. Call the station in advance to confirm any requirements. A small fee may apply.

All Together Now: Ann Arbor Business Recycling Guide

Recycle Ann Arbor is contracted by the City of Ann Arbor to collect recyclables weekly from City of Ann Arbor businesses. The City of Ann Arbor requires that all Ann Arbor businesses participate in the city's recycling program. Business recycling is provided at no additional cost, because it is funded through your City of Ann Arbor taxes.



The City of Ann Arbor's single-stream recycling system allows a wide variety of materials to be collected and recycled, all in one convenient recycling container. Acceptable materials include plastic bottles and tubs labeled: ♻️ 1, ♻️ 2, ♻️ 4, ♻️ 5, ♻️ 6 and ♻️ ♻️; bulky plastics; glass; metal; and paper, boxboard and cardboard. Turn the page to see a complete list of materials accepted, and how to recycle in the City of Ann Arbor.

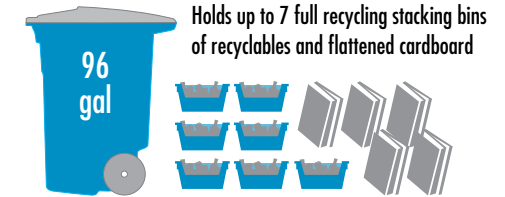
Recycle Ann Arbor also provides several free services to support your business recycling program, including:

- an on-site waste and recycling analysis
- assistance in developing a collection system, and indoor collection containers
- free education and training for recycling coordinators and employees
- extra recycling pick-ups by request

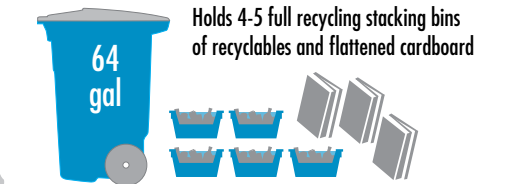
Recycling Cart Options

The standard recycling cart size for businesses is 96 gallons. Ann Arbor businesses may also choose to use the smaller, 64-gallon cart, or select the smallest option, a 32-gallon cart.

Standard 96-gallon recycling cart - 26"W x 35"D x 46"H



Medium 64-gallon recycling cart - 24"W x 27"D x 42"H



Mini 32-gallon recycling cart - 19"W x 24"D x 38"H



Is your business located in the Downtown Development Authority (DDA)? or Does your business use recycling dumpsters (no carts)?

If the answer is yes to either or both questions, your recycling services are provided directly by the City of Ann Arbor. Call (734) 994-2807, or visit www.a2gov.org for more information, or to report a missed pick-up.

If your business is located outside of the DDA, and has recycling carts, your recycling services are provided by Recycle Ann Arbor. Call (734) 662-6288 for more information, or to report a missed pick-up.

All Together Now: Ann Arbor Recycling

Carts must be out before 7 a.m. for pickup. Place cart with metal lift bar facing the street, 3 feet away from other carts, obstacles or debris.

Paper & Flattened Boxes



Everything, including cardboard, must fit inside the cart with the lid closed. Lid may not be secured.

Empty and flatten boxes.

Place shredded paper in clear, sealed plastic bags.

- Electronics
- Car batteries
- Oil filters
- Inkjet/toner cartridges
- Textiles, paired shoes
