



What is Traffic Calming?

"Traffic Calming is the combination of mainly physical measures that reduce the negative effects of motor vehicle use, alter driver behavior and improve conditions for non-motorized street users."


Things you Drive Over: Speed Humps




Things you Drive Over: Raised Crosswalk


















Device #1 - Residential Traffic Circle




Things you Drive Around: Residential Traffic Circle






Example: Yost Boulevard

Devices #2 & #3 - Raised Crosswalks




Things you Drive Over: Raised Crosswalk






Example: S. Forest Avenue






Device #1 - Residential Traffic Circle




Devices #2 & #3 - Raised Crosswalks






