Comments and Questions from the Focus Group:

- Lack of enforcement for occupancy, parking, neglect
- Need to present preservation as a public benefit. Many of the older houses not in historic districts are still historic resources for the city. It is in the interest of the City to preserve the well-built properties.
- Preservation has environmental benefits. Request an Environmental Impact study for demolition and new construction.
- Initiate some kind of demolition review.
- Create zoning incentive for preservation.
- Non-conformities are okay
- Affordability of existing housing? May be more affordable than new apartments.
- Other cities may have examples or creative student zoning, ex: Chapel Hill.
