NON-FATAL SHOOTING

On 4/7/23 at approximately 8:30pm officers responded to the 800 block of S. Maple for a report of shots fired. The on-scene investigation revealed that while a large crowd was gathered for a memorial vigil in the area, multiple shots were fired, and two men suffered gunshot wounds.

Officers on scene located a 24-year-old Ann Arbor man with a single gunshot wound to his left foot. A 25-year-old Ypsilanti man transported himself to University of Michigan hospital with gunshot wounds to his left wrist and left bicep. Both men were treated at U of M hospital for non-life-threatening injuries.

The preliminary investigation indicates that during the vigil the 25-year-old man was armed with a gun when he approached a group of people and began firing. The 24-year-old man then returned fire, and both men were wounded. A stray bullet entered a home on the 2500 block of Bens Drive and traveled into the kitchen where a family was having dinner. No one was injured inside the home.

This is an isolated incident, and the investigation remains ongoing. More information will be released later as officers conduct their investigation.
