LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Equity and justice are at the center of A²ZERO and staff in OSI are continuing to ground our work in these critical principles. In that light, we'd like to take a moment to honor the geographic and historic space we share. We acknowledge that the land the City of Ann Arbor occupies is the ancestral, traditional, and contemporary lands of the Anishinaabe and Wyandot peoples. We further acknowledge that our city stands, like almost all property in the United States, on lands obtained, generally in unconscionable ways, from indigenous peoples. The taking of this land was formalized by the Treaty of Detroit in 1807. Knowing where we live, work, study, and recreate does not change the past, but a thorough understanding of the ongoing consequences of this past can empower us in our work to create a future that supports human flourishing and justice for all individuals.

A²ZERO YEAR THREE ANNUAL REPORT

COMING SOON!

Next week we'll be unveiling the A²ZERO Year Three Annual Report. As a sneak peek, here are some highlights from the last year of our collective actions to equitably address the climate crisis:

- The 10,000 Trees Initiative has reached approximately 5,750 trees planted/distributed.
- Our A²ZERO Ambassadors program is up to 85 graduates, and we will reach over 100 ambassadors with the next cohort!
- Aging in Place Efficiently completed energy efficiency and aging in place retrofits in the homes of 17 participants, reducing energy burdens by saving \$45,800 in utility costs plus a reduction of 113 metric tons of carbon emissions.
- We installed two additional air quality monitors, bringing our total number of monitors up to four. We also launched a data visualization platform for air quality monitoring at www.a2gov.org/airdata.
- We held a Plant-Based Challenge to encourage the adoption of plant-forward diets, with over 200 participants!
- We held a Local Food Festival at the Ann Arbor Farmers Market, which was attended by seventeen local businesses, non-profits, and community organizations, as well as by over 300 residents.
- With a working group of local business owners and City staff, we developed a draft sustainable food framework.
- We procured two electric refuse trucks for the City Fleet, partially funded with approximately \$600,000 in Federal and State grants and we're nearing 20% electrification of our light fleet!
- We initiated pilot testing of the A²ZERO Home Energy Advisor Program. This will be a free service to Ann Arbor residents, and will assist individuals with evaluating their homes, creating road maps to electrification and efficiency, and connecting with contractors.
- We hosted our first Electrification Expo and are gearing up to host the second on Friday, August 11th from 5pm-9pm.
- We installed roughly 4.0 MW of solar on City facilities.
- As of May 2023, the 3-year-old Solarize program has now surpassed 4.0 MW of new solar in our region, representing over 540 installations, over \$1.8 million saved in upfront costs, and well over \$186 million saved in energy costs over the 25-year warrantied life-span of solar panels.
- We were awarded \$500,000 to advance neighborhood decarbonization in Bryant, which is helping 19 households make health, safety, and quality of life improvements.
- We were awarded a planning grant from the DOE to design a district geothermal loop in the Bryant neighborhood.
- We provided \$300,000 in grants to local housing providers to implement energy efficiency improvements in the homes and dwellings of individuals with lower incomes.
- We were awarded a grant to replace all City streetlights with LEDs, starting in 2024.
- Ann Arbor was recognized as one of only 23 Gold-level "Walk Friendly" communities in the United States.
- We completed a second resilience hub in Ann Arbor, located at the Bryant Neighborhood Community Center.
- We launched a Commercial Solar program with the 2030 District to incentivize commercial solar adoption in the County.
- We initiated work on a sustainable heating franchise and are currently collecting public feedback and ideas on how to achieve a safe, sustainable, clean, and healthy heating system for the entire community.
- For the second year in a row, Ann Arbor was recognized on the CDP's A List as one of 122 cities and counties across the globe that is taking bold leadership on environmental action and transparency.
- We launched a small grant program with Ann Arbor Public Schools to support sustainability-related projects in schools.
- The A²ZERO Collaborator network expanded and now consists of over 120 organizations.
- We hosted Vice President Kamala Harris to discuss sustainability activities in Ann Arbor.
