<p>Funding & Fees</p> <p>Residents and businesses pay haulers directly for service based on the service they select and rate quoted by hauler</p> <p>Trash tax: Haulers pay \$3.50/household/month and \$0.85/cubic yard for businesses and multi-family properties with dumpster service to fund waste reduction efforts including costs for Boulder County “Recycle Row” facilities, some costs for programs (e.g., in the past, single-stream recycling conversion)</p> <p>Bag fee: All plastic and paper bags at grocery stores have a 10 cent bag fee</p>	<p>Service Provider Private haulers, selected by customer</p>
<p>Policies, Mandates & Special Services</p> <p>Universal Zero Waste Ordinance: All haulers required to offer recycling and compost collection All properties required to recycle and compost All single-family households must subscribe to collection service All special events must provide recycling and composting</p> <p>Multi-family properties must have at least half of the capacity for recycling as they do for trash (e.g., if trash service is 2 cu. yd. per week, recycling must be at least 1 cu. yd. per week)</p> <p>Haulers must provide “6-day review” with Monday-Saturday daily collection of waste from all rental properties in designated student zones for 1 week in May and one month in July/August to support move-in / move-out; properties are charged by haulers for extra collections that are made, with containers emptied only if full (Monday-Friday) or half-full (Saturday)</p>

<p>Policies, Mandates & Special Services</p> <p>Corrugated cardboard banned from disposal April 1, 2018</p> <p>Waste Reduction and Recycling Assistance Program (WRRAP) rebates organizations for 50% (up to \$750) for recycling and composting service startup, including six months of collection service, container costs, site improvements, and education materials</p> <p>City provides no-fee benefits including on-site business consultation services, Recycle Lincoln Leadership Recognition Program, and education materials for haulers to distribute to customers</p>
