Safety Update A2 Snow Match

Become a volunteer in the City of Ann Arbor OR receive shoveling services. Snow-covered sidewalks can be hazardous for everyone. The A2 Snow Match program helps keep sidewalks accessible for all ages and abilities by pairing residents with nearby neighbors who volunteer to assist with snow removal. Recipients of volunteer services must be City residents age 55+ or self-identify as having a disability, and not have other resources (financial, family, friends or neighbors) available to help with snow removal. Volunteers are matched with homes within about a 10-minute walk of their location. Residents can register to volunteer or receive services!

Ann Arbor Awarded \$250,000 Grant to Advance Sustainable Energy Utility -- To learn more about the SEU, please visit a2gov.org/a2seu. - **NEW Residential Rebates for Leaf-Blowers.** The City of Ann Arbor just launched a new rebate program specifically for rakes and electric leaf blowers beginning November 21, 2025, through the end of the year, or until funding is expended. Designed to help lower the cost of transitioning from gas to electric leaf blowers in accordance with Ann Arbor's leaf blower ordinance, these rebates will be available to all Ann Arbor residents.
- Business Rebates for Electric Leaf Blowers Business rebates for electric leaf blowers have been reinstated through September 30, 2026, or until funding is expended. Designed to help lower the cost of transitioning from gas to electric leaf blowers in accordance with Ann Arbor's leaf blower ordinance, these rebates will be available to businesses that provide lawn care or landscaping services to properties located in Ann Arbor.
- City of Ann Arbor Recognized as Sustainable Public Entity of the Year by Michigan Sustainable Business Forum. The City of Ann Arbor was awarded the 2025 Sustainable Business of the Year: Public Sector Award from the Michigan Sustainable Business Forum on November 13 at their Triple Bottom Line Bash.

The award recognizes a local or regional government for its efforts to advance community sustainability and sustainable business practices in their community and operations. It was awarded to the City of Ann Arbor for their work under A2ZERO, the City's plan, vision, framework, and associated actions to achieve a just and equitable transition to carbon neutrality, community-wide, by the year 2030.
