I. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

The following Questions have been received by the City. Responses are being provided in accordance with the terms of the RFP. Respondents are directed to take note in its review of the documents of the following questions and City responses as they affect work or details in other areas not specifically referenced here.

- Question 1: In regard to the A2L refrigerant regulations kicking off on December 31st, will businesses that participate in the City's refrigerant management programs be required to change over to these, or will the vendor simply be helping to detect leaks?
- Answer 1: Participating in the technical assistance program will not require businesses to take any actions regarding their refrigerants beyond what is already required by law. The technical assistance visits are an opportunity for the vendor to provide refrigerant management best practices guidance and resources to participating businesses. However, anyone participating in the grant program will be required to use the grant money to purchase only refrigerants from the EPA Significant New Alternatives Policy list and refrigeration systems that are compatible with them.
