- **Neighborhood Grocery Initiatives (NGI):** Monthly perishable food distributions at affordable housing communities throughout the county. NGIs provide produce along with other staples to families, individuals, and seniors who may not be able to travel to other local food distribution sites.

- **SHOP FOR GROCERIES:** Groceries can be picked up ONCE a month by arranging a time. No walk ups for pantry shopping. Call 734.484.2989 any weekday from 9 a.m.-4 p.m. to schedule an appointment to shop.
- **WALK-UP GROCERIES:** Basic food items can be picked up at the Farm Stand located at 454 Harriet St. on Mondays from 9:30 a.m.-noon, Thursdays from 12:30-3 p.m., and Saturdays from 11 a.m.-12:30 p.m.
- **FRESH PRODUCE:** Produce can also be picked up at the Farm Stand once a week on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday evenings. MUST call in advance to reserve a spot.
- **GROCERY DELIVERY:** Deliveries made on Wednesday or Friday between 1-4 p.m. Individual or family must live within 10 miles of Hope Clinic. Call clinic to arrange delivery.
- **HOT MEALS:** No appointment necessary. Every day except Wednesday from 5-6 p.m.
- **EMERGENCY FOOD:** Individuals can obtain one bag of emergency food at the clinic's front office Monday-Friday from 9 a.m.-4 p.m.

- *Eligibility requirements include those who are medically homebound or have physical restrictions in preparing and cooking food.*
- *Process includes Individuals providing a homebound status report from primary care physician and contacting Meals on Wheels to complete an in-home assessment.*

- *Food provided: CAN provides perishable and nonperishable food assistance to Washtenaw County residents at our Bryant and Brick locations with no fee or document restrictions. Individuals will need to sign a USDA form for funding purposes.*
- **Bryant:** Emergency food pantry every Monday through Thursday from 10 a.m.-3 p.m. and Friday from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. with large food distributions on Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 10 a.m.-3 p.m.
- **Brick:** Monday through Wednesday from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. and Thursday from 11 a.m.-2 p.m.

Hot lunch and cold dinner are offered to eligible homebound individuals regardless of age or financial status. Meals are low in salt and fat and are appropriate for diabetics. A vegetarian option is available. Meals delivered on Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years days; frozen meals delivered in advance of Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day and the day after Thanksgiving. Six shelf-stable meals are delivered each year for use in an emergency. Fresh produce may be provided in addition to meals. Serves Eastern Washtenaw County.

- Personal Care Pantry — provides non-food essentials such as personal grooming items, medical equipment and incontinence products up to two times per week.
- Pets Assisting the Lives of Seniors (P.A.L.S.) — in partnership with the Humane Society of Huron Valley and MOW America's We Love Pets — food, treats and cat litter are delivered monthly.
- Starbucks Bistro Packs — Breakfast sandwiches, pastries, hard-boiled eggs, fruit, cheese, etc. are donated and delivered three times per week. Visit website or call for current days/hours.
