TRAINING SUMMARY

JULY 2024 to JUNE 2025

EXTERNAL TRAINING

- Number of external training events: 108
- Total number of external training hours (total manpower hours): 5,899

IN-HOUSE ACADEMIES

- In-House Academy number of training hours (manpower hours): 2,648
- 4 recruit officers in the October 2024 In-House [5 weeks, 192 hours]
- 4 recruit officers in the November 2024 In-House [5 weeks, 168 hours]
- 2 recruit officers in the February 2025 In-House [5 weeks, 184 hours]
- 2 recruit officers and 3 cadets in the May 2025 In-House [192 hours for officers, 152 hours for cadets]

INTERNAL TRAINING

- Topics included: Basic Leadership, Patrol Model, Defensive Tactics, Firearms, Legal Update, Community Policing, Less Lethal Training, CRIT, NAMI, Policy Update, and Taser training.
- Number of sworn personnel attending: 109
- The final 3 sessions of ART were postponed from the spring and completed this summer. The number of in-person hours were reduced to 24 hours from 36 hours by moving several classes online. Hours still included in the overall total.

Active Assailant Training

Sworn Personnel participated in Countywide Active Shooter training. 100 members of the Ann Arbor Police Department participated in the Countywide Training.

Online training

- AAPD started utilizing the PoliceOne platform for CPE mandated courses. Officers will complete 8 hours of training dealing with Mental Health crisis in 2025.
- Additionally, officers completed the Annual MCOLES active-Duty Firearms Knowledge component, security procedures, LEIN recertification, and Taser knowledge recertification test, hearing conservation, respiratory protection, and confined spaces.
- Non-sworn personnel completed courses in Bloodborne Pathogens, driver safety, active shooter response, and emergency action plans for office employees.

Number totals do not include weekly K-9 training, monthly SWAT training, firearms/rifle qualifications or Crisis Negotiation Team training.
