I. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

The following Questions have been received by the City. Responses are being provided in accordance with the terms of the RFP. Respondents are directed to take note in its review of the documents of the following questions and City responses as they affect work or details in other areas not specifically referenced here.

- Question 1: The City of Ann Arbor, Michigan, is requesting proposals from State of Michigan licensed electrical contractors. Is this a requirement to be licensed electrical contractor for the State of Michigan?
- Answer 1: Yes, it is required for the bidder be a licensed electrical contractor in the State of Michigan. Partnering with a licensed electrical contractor in the State of Michigan is allowed.
- Question 2: Written in SECTION II SCOPE OF SERVICES; Contractors will supply a proposal based on a three-year agreement from the period of July 1, 2020, to June 30, 2023. The bid due date indicated in the schedule shows August 11, 2020. Does the actual contract date start when successfully awarded?
