Bids that fail to provide these forms listed above upon bid opening may be rejected as non-responsive and may not be considered for award.

I. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

The following Questions have been received by the City. Responses are being provided in accordance with the terms of the ITB. Bidders are directed to take note in their review of the documents of the following questions and City responses as they affect work or details in other areas not specifically referenced here.

Question 1: Multiple manufacturer options: We would like to quote alternative manufacturers for each of the four categories. The current bid table appears to have space for a single manufacturer per category — are bidders permitted to submit alternate/substitute options (e.g., via additional tabs or a separate schedule), or are we limited to one manufacturer per category?

Answer 1: Respondents may offer multiple alternatives in each category if desired. In this case, please duplicate the relevant tab(s) so that each product offering has its own tab.

Question 2: Domestic content threshold: For panels to qualify under the "domestic content" category in this bid, is there a minimum domestic content percentage the City requires (e.g., 50% of manufactured cost per IRA/Treasury guidance, or a separate City-defined threshold)?

Answer 2: The materials procured via this ITB will be used in projects with a maximum net output of less than 1 MW that will begin construction prior to July 4, 2026 and will complete construction within three years of that date. The domestic content percentage must be the minimum required to qualify such projects for the 10% domestic content bonus for the federal investment tax credit.

Bidders are responsible for any conclusions that they may draw from the information contained in the Addendum.
