SAFETY NOTES

Safety Update Air Quality. Fires in Canada are again causing air pollution throughout Michigan which can pose health concerns for many people. Smoke generated from these forest fires contain a complex mixture of harmful gases, vapors and particulate matter (PM 2.5). Exposure to these pollutants is associated with numerous health problems including lung irritation, asthma, coughing, wheezing, bronchitis, increased risk of heart problems and an increased susceptibility to respiratory illnesses. Vulnerable populations such as children, the elderly, and individuals with pre-existing conditions are particularly susceptible. To protect yourself, it is important to stay informed about the air quality conditions. Sources like NOAA (<https://www.noaa.gov/>) and Air Now (<https://www.airnow.gov>) provide real-time air quality reports, forecasts, and includes protective measures to take when necessary. **Thank you for making A2 Be Safe!**

Only 112 cities worldwide, or 15% of the CDP's scored cities, earned the top status of an A score. And, Ann Arbor is only one of 29 US cities to receive an A!
- **Ann Arbor one of two cities to receive Platinum Status from the Michigan Green Communities Challenge:** The MGC Challenge is an annual program that serves as a guide to help communities measure their progress towards sustainability. This is the first year the Platinum certification has been offered, and recognizes only two cities achieving that status, demonstrating Ann Arbor and Grand Rapids' unique commitment and dedication to creating a sustainable community.

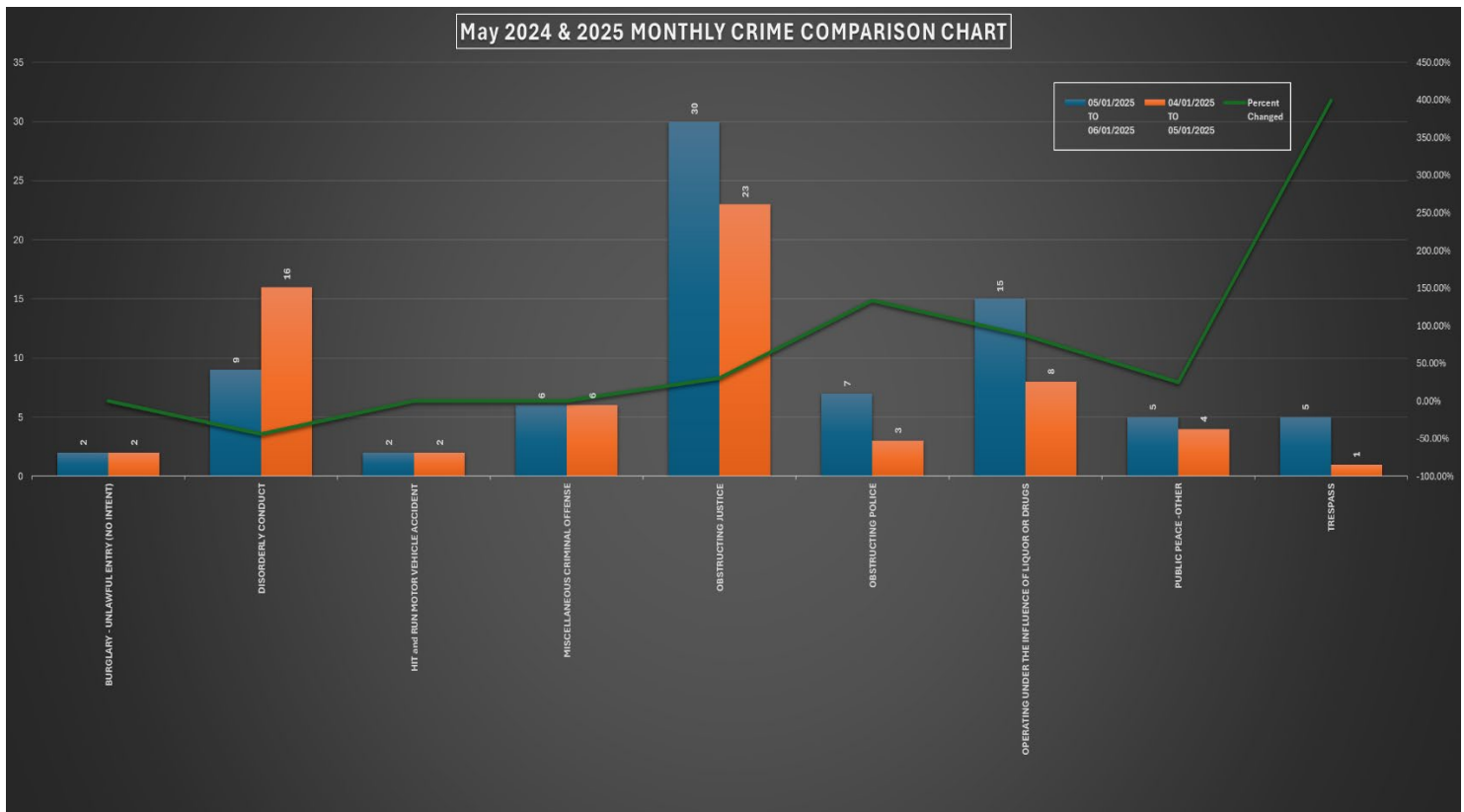
