Overview

An electronic meeting through Zoom was held to provide a brief overview of the Traffic Calming process, to discuss the Starter Idea specific to Carmel Street between Easy Street and Towner Boulevard as modifications to the Starter Idea. Discussion

- **1.** Speed Humps: Can an additional speed hump be added to the straight away section between Towner Blvd and the Carmel St curve?
 - **a.** (*Post-Meeting Notes*) Initial review shows there is not enough room for an additional device in this section to meet the City's preferred spacing guidelines and to maintain a safe clearance from the intersection. Additional review is being done to address concerns at the curve.







3. Do you support Device #1, Speed Hump? (Multiple Choice)



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
