Look for flashing yellow beacons, indicating the presence of pedestrians at the crosswalk.

Slow down as you approach the crosswalk.

Stop behind the painted stop bar line on the street.

Wait until the pedestrians have safely reached a refuge island or sidewalk before proceeding.





Push the button to activate the crosswalk beacon.

Look to your right and left to make sure oncoming vehicles have stopped before stepping into the street.

Be aware of traffic while crossing.
