Question #40: Could we please have a comparison on both rates and rationale behind the rates for water service in Lansing, Grand Rapids and Kalamazoo? These three cities have varying water rates, and it would be valuable to understand both the City's rationale and the peer cities' rationales. (Councilmember Briere)

<u>Response</u>: Attached is the typical annual comparison we complete. Since Kalamazoo does not have a comparable system, they are not typically included.
